The graduation rate has been increasing over the years and so has been the enrollment rate.

TEACHING PRACTICE

The first teaching practice for 27 students of third years Bachelor of Science in Agricultural Education and Extension started on 7th May, 2012 and ended August 2012. They did their Farm practice between February to April and immediately after proceeded to teaching practice where they were deployed in secondary schools.

CMAAE STUDENTS 3RD TERM

For the first time the Department organized the teaching of CMAAE students during the third semester starting 3rd September 2012. The MSc- CMAAE students who did not go to the shared facility at the University of Pretoria South Africa were enrolled to do units offered in South Africa. All the students passed.

THE SHARED FACILITY FOR SPECIALIZATION AND ELECTIVES

The 7th cohort of CMAAE students who came from the shared facility undertaking their electives and specialization at the University of Pretoria South Africa also sat for their GRE examinations. There were 19 students. All the students passed their course work except one who was unable to do exams but has now done special/supplementary and passed. The students are all in the field for data collection as most of them have submitted their proposals to the BPS.

The 8th cohort (2012/2013) has 24 students. The students have successfully completed their first semester and are now in their second semester. Only 15 students out of the 24 students will go to the shared facility at the University of Pretoria. The Departmental graduation rate so far is 71% for male and 30% for female.

In the 7th cohort (2011-2012) academic year, the number of Non-Nationals in the Department was 11 and Nationals were 15.

OUTREACH ACTIVITIES/COMMUNITY SERVICE

1. COLLABORATIONS IN CAPACITY BUILDING

October – November 2012: Members of the Department who teach Agribusiness Management courses [Dr. Julius Okello, Dr. David Jakinda, Dr. Rose Nyikal, Dr. Sabina Wangia, Dr. Jonathan Nzuma] and Chairman of the Department [Dr. Fred Mugivane] participated in a Committee appointed by the Dean, Faculty of Agriculture to develop a **Certificate Course in Agribusiness Management for STVS college in Somaliland**. This was in response to a formal request from international development partners.

2. RESEARCH OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

- *June - July 2012:* Dissemination workshops for results of research on agricultural commercialization and food security in Eastern Africa. Collaborative workshop between University of Nairobi and the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) were held in Nairobi [organized by Dr. Julius Okello].
- *July 2012:* Focus Group Discussions were held with local community members and agriculture leaders in Tana Delta as part of participatory planning stakeholder meetings for a research project on Foreign Land Investments. The meetings were organized by Dr. David Jakinda.

4. STUDENT INDUSTRIAL ATTACHMENT

Third year Bsc. Agribusiness Management students usually complete a full semester [Year 3 Semester two] on Industrial/Field Attachment in different parts of Kenya. In the last academic year, students were attached in Agribusiness Firms and Companies dealing with Agricultural Marketing/Market Information [e.g., M-Farm, Eastern Africa Grain Council],

Regional Agriculture and Environment [e.g., Arid Lands Information Network], Agricultural Processing [New KCC, Tea Companies, DelMonte], financial institutions for example the Rural Finance Department of Equity Bank, Agricultural Research Institutions such as the Kenya Sugar Research Foundation, and various Farmer Field Schools across the country. Teams of Agribusiness staff normally visit the students after two months of attachment to assess their progress, and obtain useful feedback for improvement of the attachment programme as well as other aspects of the entire Agribusiness Management training. Stakeholders have so far expressed satisfaction with the quality of training offered in the Agribusiness Degree Course. The Agribusiness Management Programme is currently being led by Dr. David Jakinda, and various members of staff are usually requested to perform the assessment in different parts of the country each year.
