Rules:

- A participating team must comprise multidisciplinary members beyond current disciplines and schools involved in One Health, including at least a computer science student.
- Interested teams must submit their idea for consideration of participation.
- The participating team must agree to develop an-original idea of a free, open source App, in line with the applicable policies on content and materials development that shall be presented.
- All students and participating teams must follow government guidelines for prevention of COVID-19 pandemic, as they execute their projects.
- Institutions can have several student teams making submissions

Review Criteria: Submissions will be reviewed by a panel of experts and will be based on novelty, feasibility and impact of the idea as well as team constitution. All students are welcome to participate. Gender-sensitive and multi-school teams are highly encouraged.

Prizes and incentives will be available including: A determined prize award; Certificates jointly signed by AFROHUN and Maker Space; Eligibility to use the Maker Space for your innovations; An opportunity for three winning teams to participate in a 12-week online mentorship program by the Child Development Foundation (UK) on skills for the future including Entrepreneurship and Client Management (Theory to Practice) and Trends in Technology including Artificial Intelligence, Big Data, Internet of all Things and Machine Learning.
